Tickets on sale now!





Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day, (on February 14) is when lovers express their affection with greetings and gifts. Given their similarities, it has been suggested that the holiday has origins in the Roman festival of Lupercalia held in mid-February. The festival, which celebrated the coming of spring, included fertility rites and the pairing off of women with men by lottery. (ohh! At least things have changes somewhat!) At the end of the 5th century, Pope Gelasius I forbid the celebration of Lupercalia and he is sometimes attributed with replacing it with St. Valentine's Day, but the true origin of the holiday is vague at best. Valentine's Day did not come to be celebrated as a day of romance until about the 14th century.

Although there were several Christian martyrs named Valentine, the day may have taken its name from a priest who was martyred about 270 ce by the emperor Claudius II. According to legend, the priest signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended and, by some accounts, healed from blindness. Other accounts hold that it was St.Valentine of Terni for whom the holiday was named, though it is possible the two saints were actually one person. Another common legend states tha St Valentine defied the emperor's orders and secretly married couples to spare the husbands from war. It is for this reason thathis feast day is associated with Love!

Formal messages, or Valentines, appeared in the 1500s, and by the late 1700s commercially printed cards were being used. Valentines commonly depict Cupid, the Roman god of love, along withhearts, traditionally the seat of emotion.

Because itwas thought that birds start their mating season inmid-February, doves and other birds also became a symbol of the day. A friend always finds her ducks start laying eggs on 14 th February! Traditional gifts include chocolate, flowers particularly red roses, a symbol of beauty and love.

But not eggs, we save them for Easter!



Repair Lafe LB and Borrowers LB

A Repair Cafe has been operating in Leighton Buzzard for a few years and is very popular, a chance to breathe new life into damaged items or non-functioning equipment.

They are launching a Borrowers group, a 'Library of Things', where items can be borrowed for a time, similar to a book library but of equipment that we may only need for a short time, such as a sewing machine or garden tools. Members pay a small fee towards the loan and there will be special arrangements for those on benefits. At present, the location for the Library is not sorted but there should be news soon. *Both groups can be followed on Facebook.*

With so many of our own village facing or having gone through orthopaedic operations, we have some gadgets that could be shared or borrowed (mine will be off to LB once not needed, so let me know if it can help....Toilet raisers, crutches, walking stick, 'Socker' (for getting socks on your feet when Dobbie is too busy to help).

Traffic issues in Cublington

As there have been quite a few accidents in the village recently the Parish Council is reviewing how best to address the issue/matter.

Just before Christmas the Parish Council held an informal site meeting with the Bucks Transport Strategy Manager and our local Unitarian Councillor Diana Blamires.

From that meeting we have been advised to contact Bucks Highways Commissioning setting out our concerns supported by appropriate statistics and documentation together with our recommendations. We are in the process of obtaining the data for this submission. This will involve having to commission a traffic survey which records the speed , number and type of vehicles passing through the village.

We had our attention drawn to an E petition which was posted on the Buckinghamshire Council website setting out the traffic issues and suggested recommendations which were:

Improved Signage Speed Control Measures Restriction on Heavy Vehicles Passing Points

The Parish Council will seek advice on these suggestions from Bucks Highways Commissioning Department, taking into account feasibility and costs before deciding how best to proceed. The Parish Council will keep residents informed as discussions progress.

North Field Update

The weather since the New Year has been quite changeable, wet and cold on some days, and cold and wet on others; in fact it's been so cold that the wet has crystallised into lumps forming a sharp frost as the pictures below show. Too cold for any planting, but an ideal time for some maintenance tasks checking tree ties, tree stakes, repairing some of the deer netting and filling in around tree roots where dogs and/or badgers have been digging;

You may have noticed some clearing of brambles and digging happening on North Field along the western boundary fence down towards the old pond, this has been done in preparation for some drainage work being laid across North Field. This work will connect to drainage pipes to be installed on Orchard Ground, one past the pavilion and the other up towards the cricket practice nets. This will help drain the cricket outfield areas which over the past few years have been very wet with areas of standing water in the autumn and winter months. Cublington Cricket Club are very grateful to The Heart of Bucks Foundation for their grant of £5,000 which will fund the majority of this drainage work.

To those walking on North Field, you may want to take one the wandering paths to the far side of the field to avoid the mud.

Dates for the North Field working groups: Saturday 9.30am until 12.00 noon

8th, 22nd February; 8th and 22nd March.

Working groups finish with hot drinks and bacon/sausage rolls. All are welcome to drop in to the pavilion for refreshments.





HOUSE OF COMMONS

I am delighted to write for the latest edition of the Cublington Crier as your Member of Parliament for Aylesbury and the villages.

I have continued to be out and about across the villages I represent over the past few months, meeting residents and hearing your priorities.

I have been holding "Meet and Greet" sessions in the villages that form part of Aylesbury constituency, so far in Ivinghoe, Edlesborough and Cheddington. These informal coffee mornings are fantastic opportunities for me to hear residents' feedback and ideas on how I can best support their community. I am planning on holding one to serve Cublington residents as soon as I can.

Parliament returned in January and the Government has been getting on with the work of change. In this column

I will highlight two priorities that I think will make a real difference to residents here in Cublington.

First, we have set out our plans for the NHS, including the plan to clear the backlog of almost 70,000 patients waiting more than 18 weeks for NHS treatment in Aylesbury constituency. With so many people waiting for treatment, it is more urgent than ever that we reform our NHS so it will always be there for you when you need it.

Our Elective Reform Plan sets out a whole system approach to hitting the 18-week referral to treatment target by the end of this Parliament.

This includes opening Community Diagnostic Centres on evenings and weekends so that many more people will be able to access tests and checks while going about their daily lives, and the NHS will also increase the number of surgical hubs, which help protect planned care from the impact of seasonal and other pressures.

The plan will drive forward progress on the government's first steps commitment to deliver 2 million extra appointments in its first year, equivalent to 40,000 every week. The reforms will put patients first, harness technology to support staff and help the NHS to do things more efficiently.

I am pleased that we have provided the biggest boost to GP funding in years - an additional £889m on top of the existing budget for general practice - and set out reforms to cut red tape and bring back the family doctor. We have also made the biggest investment into hospices and end of life care in a generation ensuring that hospices can continue to deliver the highest quality end of life care possible for their patients, families, and loved ones. The Government has announced a £100 million boost for adult and children's hospices to ensure they have the best physical environment for care, and £26 million revenue to support children and young people's hospices.

I am taking a leading role in delivering these reforms as the government's National Health Mission Delivery Champion.

Second, we are taking action on the record levels of illegal sewage dumping we inherited from the last Conservative government.

Our new Water (Special Measures) Bill introduces a significant increase in enforcement powers to end the disgraceful behaviour of water companies and their bosses. Water executives will no longer line their own pockets whilst pumping out this filth. If they refuse to comply, they will face severe penalties including criminal charges.

This Bill is a major step forward in our wider reform to fix the broken water system. The Labour Government will outline further legislation to fundamentally transform how the water industry is run and speed up the delivery of upgrades to our sewage infrastructure to clean up our waterways for good.

I look forward to serving the people of Cublington in 2025. I am here to listen and to help you. The best way to reach me is on *laura.kyrkesmith.mp@parliament.uk*. Minutes of a meeting of Cublington Parish Council held on 14th January 2025 at the Village Hall at 7.30pm

1. Apologies

2. Minutes of last meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on 12th November 2024 were discussed by the meeting and duly signed by the Chair.

3. Declaration of Interest

None.

4. Reports

The meeting discussed the road accidents in the village over the past few months. An e petition had been lodged on the Buckinghamshire Council website asking for a review of traffic issues within the village. Ms Parker, Community Board Manager, set out BC procedures for E Petitions. The petition closed on 10th January and two people had signed it. CPC contacted BC to find out who had sponsored the petition. BC is not allowed to disclose the sponsor, and we asked the BC to let the sponsor know we were keen to discuss the matter with them. Nothing was heard back. Bucks Highways would not review the traffic issues without data to support it. CPC is in contact with BH to complete four site surveys recording volume, speeds and types of vehicles. The survey will be on all the four roads coming into the village. The surveys will cover a 7day period. The last survey was in 2019.

Our review of the data will determine what to ask for from BH. There are two grants' applications in progress with the Community Board one for storage facility on North Field and one for the path by

Orchard Ground pavilion. Ms Parker offered to send through appropriate wording for the applications to Cllr Waters. Wing Caravan Park will require new planning approval for use as a caravan park. This site is not in our parish and the Unitarian Councillors were asked to notify us if any application comes in. The Unitarian Councillors confirmed that surplus reserves at BC are not being lost to less well off councils.

5.1 To approve payments since last meeting.

The following invoices were passed for payment from 1st November to 31st December 2024:

19/11 Autela Payroll £75.05

22/11 H Vale £321.68 -Orchard Ground replacement gate recharge

28/11 Clerk Salary £198.47 - Nov salary

23/12 PAYE £148.60 – quarterly tax

23/12 Mainly Mowing £546.25 – mowing work.

27/12 Clerk Salary £198.27 - Dec salary

30/12 Bucks Council £342.00 – dog waste collection to 31/3/25

5.2 To review the accounting statements to 31st December 2024 and forecast to 31st March 2025

M Joy presented the accounts to 31st December 2024 which showed a surplus of £5,784.07 and cash balances of £20,242.09. The forecast to 31st March 2025 estimates a surplus of £5,278.46 and cash balances of £19,737.38.

5.3 Precept Calculation 2025/26

A forecast of income and expenditure for 2025/26 was presented to the meeting which showed a deficit of £320 after allowing £5,000 for traffic calming measures and survey costs. It was agreed the precept should increase by £1,325 to £14,555 (10.02% increase). Cllr Shults proposed to adopt the precept and Cllr Antosiewicz seconded it.

6. Orchard Ground/ North Field Report

The fortnightly drinks evenings are well attended with occasional food nights.

The planned drainage work by the cricket club was cancelled because the contractor could not complete the work. There was a grant of £5,000 from Heart of Bucks for the drainage work and HB has asked for a return of the money. Cllr Waters notified HB of the delays and told them the work will be completed by a new contractor by the end of May – HB has agreed to this rescheduling of the work. The Accounts and Annual Report were presented at the AGM. North

Field work continues with general maintenance.

There are three grants in progress –

Tree Council £1,860, Community Board – footpath £7,900 and storage container £4,000.

A letter was sent to Lucy Developers , the owners of Walnuts houses, asking for a meeting to discuss a contribution to our projects following the Inspectorate decision not to apply a S106 £24,000 levy on the development .

6.1 New Charity and lease

The application for registration of the charity is still progress.

7. Planning Permissions

7.1 APP/J0405/X/21/3287648 Wing Caravan Site, Wing Road – Inspectorate upheld the appeal and awarded costs against Buckinghamshire Council. The planning department confirmed a new application would be required for a caravan site.

8. Village Matters

8.1 Traffic - calming

Speedwatch has been restricted due to poor weather and holidays . E petition was discussed under item 4 of the minutes. It was suggested an article is put into the

Crier about accidents and inappropriate lorry movements in the village are recorded and reported to the clerk.

8.2 Trees and hedges

Cllr Reilly to draft an article for the Crier and write to all the residents whose properties back onto the High Street setting out their responsibilities to ensure their hedges and/or trees are not impeding paths and street lighting. A quote has been obtained for cutting back foliage around the lights on the High Street. Further quotes to be obtained.

8.3 *Granite sculpture – war memorial* Cllr Reilly had circulated plans for a granite war memorial. Planning permission is required. Local tradesmen will be used for the work. Drawings are being prepared and an estimate of the costs.

8.4 Other

It was noted there was a group of villagers looking into buying The Unicorn Pub under Community ownership.

The bench commemorating Arthur Read has been delivered.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will take place on Tuesday 11th March 2025 at 7.30pm at the Village Hall.



Their charitable income enables them to offer extra services and therapies which further enhance the lives of patients and residents. These extras include:

- assistive technologies and devices that allow patients to communicate in person and online
- a bespoke wheelchair service that ensures every patient/resident has the right mobility solution for them
- Leisure and Families Service normally run weekly interest groups and organise trips/holidays.

As they believe in looking at a person as a whole, choice and communication are integral to everything they do and the decisions they make. Though levels of ability are different from person to person, they work to provide the best possible quality of life for everyone entrusted to their care.

Caught on camera – man fined after being caught dumping waste on private driveway

A man who brazenly dumped a large amount of waste on a private driveway in High Wycombe has paid the penalty for his crime in court as he is forced to pay more than £2,000 in fines and costs.

Terrance Davies, 62, from Havenfield Drive in High Wycombe, pleaded guilty to the offence of the illegal dumping of waste when he appeared at High Wycombe Magistrates' Court on Wednesday 11 December 2024.

The court heard that on Sunday 3 September 2023, an excessive amount of green waste was dumped at Marlow Road in High Wycombe. What Davies didn't realise at the time, was that the act was caught on private CCTV from one of the properties in the road and was sent to Buckinghamshire Council's waste enforcement team as evidence.

The footage clearly showed a vehicle pulling into a private driveway and a male exiting the vehicle before dumping two full buckets and a large pile of green waste in the driveway. The male then got back in his vehicle and drove away.

Investigations carried out by the enforcement team traced the vehicle back to Davies. Officers attempted to speak to Davies to ask him to explain his actions, however he refused to cooperate leaving the council with no option but to summons him to court.

Magistrates at High Wycombe Magistrates' Court heard the case, fining Davies £576 and ordered him to pay full costs of £1,242.67. A victim surcharge of £230 was also levied – making a total to pay of £2,048.67.

Thomas Broom, Buckinghamshire Council's Cabinet Member for Climate Change and Environment said: "We have a zero



tolerance to fly-tipping of any type in Buckinghamshire. This criminal found out the hard way that simply trying to ignore our attempts to investigate doesn't pay off and he has ended up paying much more in terms of costs than he would have done had he simply admitted the offence in the first instance."

Thomas explained: "In simple cases of this type, our initial course of action is to issue the person responsible for the offence with a Fixed Penalty Notice. At the time this offence took place that would have been £400, but the amount has now risen to £1,000. Unfortunately, Mr Davies chose to ignore our efforts to speak with him and so we were left with no other choice but to put him in front of a court where he ended up out of pocket; more than four times the amount he would have done if he had admitted his guilt straightaway."
