The Biggs pavilion was packed with enthusiastic supporters of the Save the Pub campaign. The Unicorn in Cublington has been closed since August 2024 and it's very clear to see there is massive support in the community to secure its future. The meeting was held on Tuesday 25th March at 7.30pm and a warm welcome given by Martyn Waters, who was followed by Phil Spooner, a resident of Aston Abbots, who spoke about the devastating impact it has had on his village community with the closure of The Royal Oak.

Simon Wilkinson, a property specialist in the area, then spoke about the importance a pub has to a community, not just in making it a classical English village, but in securing the future value in our homes.

The pub is not only a wonderful asset for us all to enjoy, the lack of one can decrease the value of your home by around 10%! A heartfelt speech was then given by Steve Markwell, a Cublington resident of 10 years, who asked the village to 'Roar' as it had done when threatened by demolition for a proposed new airport in the 1960's and early 70's. Let's 'unite' again and secure this' core of our community' for generations to come! Rousing applause followed. Nigel Loli then completed proceedings with a well supported questions and answers session, some of the points raised included:

The difference between a managed pub and a tenanted pub.

A managed pub would mean that the owners (the village) elect a board responsible for hiring a chef, manager etc, who are paid wages. The owners are then responsible for all costs but would share or reinvest any profits. A tenanted pub sees the village lease the pub entirely, and the tenants then pay rent and all other costs and retain any profits. The rental income can be redistributed to the shareholders or reinvested in the pub.

The group strongly promoted the idea a tenanted pub, as there isn't the skills nor appetite for risk, to try to manage the pub ourselves.

Please complete the form below if you would like more information. Ultimately, we need to judge the appetite of the community to buy the Unicorn so we are asking people to pledge between £1,000 to £100,000 to see if we can get near our minimum target of £800,000. All pledges must be received/emailed in by 15th April please.





Cublington Traffic Issues - HGVs

In the article that was published in the Crier in February 2025, it was reported that the Parish Council had had a site meeting with the Bucks Transport Strategy Manager and our Unitary Councillor, Diana Blamires.

We were advised at the time that it was unlikely that, in the near future, a freight restriction would be placed on routes through the village. We were however also told about informal steps that have been taken in Aston Abbotts to try and reduce the amount of heavy freight (single Trailer 3- or 4-axle Trucks or greater) through their village. From the enquiries that have since been made we understand that the initiative has had some success in reducing the number of HGVs using the village

How the Scheme Works:

The scheme works by residents simply noting the name of the company of any lorries driving towards and through the village together with time, date and direction of travel.

This information is passed to a central point, the company can then be contacted and asked if it would be possible for them to find alternative routes in future. At the time of contact it would be explained that it was felt that the narrow and rural nature of the roads around and through the village made them unsuitable for HGVs.

Orchard Ground Update

Orchard Ground is pleased to have received a grant from the Wing and Ivinghoe Communities Board (Buckinghamshire Council) for £4,725. This is a 50% grant towards the cost of two accessible paths which will give better access to the pavilion. Orchard Ground will fund the other 50%. A new path will connect the driveway to the front entrance to the pavilion. The paving slab path to the side of the pavilion to the patio area will be replaced. This work will be done in two stages with the path across to the front entrance to be completed first.





North Field Update

Walking the field just prior to writing this article, some of the blossom is already starting to break along the Stewkley Road side where the field is a bit more sheltered with cherry blossom already in flower. The trees in the orchard and in the blossom circle will soon be in blossom too and should look a picture.

All of the trees funded by the Tree Council grant have now been planted, staked and have had composted bark added around the base. Those walking the field will have seen a large Douglas Fir planted near to the Stewkley Road corner of North Field. This tree has been donated to North Field, it had been grow in a very large pot for many years. Hopefully, being planted in the field will give it a new lease of life.

We've had two deliveries of chipped wood from a local contractor who does tree work around the local area, thank you Tim (The Tree Rangers).

We have a great team of twenty three volunteers who give their time for the many tasks that are undertaken throughout the year on North Field. We recognise that people have many calls on their time with work and other commitments, also that Saturday mornings are precious. Our volunteers dip in and out of working on North Field when their

other commitments permit.



2. Minutes of last meeting

The minutes of the last meeting held on 14th January 2025 were discussed by the meeting and duly signed by the Chair.

3. Declaration of Interest

Cllr Antosiewicz item 8.4 Village Hall and Cllr Shults item 8.3 Arthur Read's Bench

4. Reports

There were no reports received from our Unitary Councillors.

5.1 To approve payments since last meeting.

5.2 To review the accounting statements to 28th February 2025 and forecast to 31st March 2025

M Joy presented the accounts to 28th February 2025 which showed a surplus of £4,183.23 and cash balances of £18,642.15. The forecast to 31st March 2025 estimates a surplus of £4,972.23 and

cash balances of £19,431.15.

6. Orchard Ground/ North Field Report

The fortnightly drinks evenings are well attended with monthly food nights. OG social events are all sold out, and it had been suggested OG applies for a liquor licence rather than a TENS licence. The meeting felt this was not advisable as a possible change of use application on the Unicorn would be difficult to challenge if OG had a licence.

Cllr Walters reported he had been successful in securing a grant from the Community Trust for £4,725 for accessible footpaths. North Field work continues with general maintenance. OG and Cublington Cricket Club had drawn up a licence agreement for the use of the cricket pitch and pavilion and asked for CPC to review the agreement. Mike Joyand Cllr Antosiewicz to review theagreement and consult with Cllr Watersand Harry Gadsby on it. It was suggestedthis agreement should be described as aMemorandum of Understanding. OG istrying to establish a budget and reviewingits fees in September.

6.1 New Charity and lease

The application for registration of the charity is still in progress.

7. Planning Permissions

7.1 24/02425/APP Great Oak Farm

Dunton Road Cublington Buckinghamshire LU7 OLS Change of use of farmyard and farm buildings from agricultural to B2 (general industrial) use and associated storage and parking, demolition of barn, erection of a single storey side extension to workshop building, placement of three portacabins, and internal and external alterations to buildings by The Quartz Worktop Company Limited (Retrospective) – no objection

7.2 25/**00363**/**COUAR**- Rockwell Reads Lane Cublington Buckinghamshire LU7 0LE Prior notification application (Part 3, Class Q) for change of use and conversion of an existing agricultural barn into 1no. dwelling – no objection.

7.3 25/00398/ALB Old Manor Farm Reads Lane Cublington Buckinghamshire LU7 0LE Listed building consent for the removal of a section of garden wall which is in a poor state of repair and replacement with close board fencing to match the existing fence which the wall currently abuts on the Eastern end – no objection

8. Village Matters

8.1 Traffic - calming.

There had been a serious road traffic accident at the crossroads in the afternoon. A member of the public contacted the clerk by email stating not enough was being done concerning traffic calming. The meeting discussed the email and reiterated the points raised in previous meetings and articles in the Crier.

The Parish Council is concerned about the traffic issues facing the village. A survey costing £2,200 had been carried out on the four roads leading to and from the village the results from which will be to used to present to Bucks Highways Commissioning including details of accidents, near misses and speedwatch with a request on guidance for suitable solutions to our traffic issues. We are having to follow 'due process' with Buckinghamshire Council which unfortunately takes a long time. Any solutions will involve a cost to us which needs to be quantified.

8.2 Granite sculpture

Cllr Reilly ran through the plans for a war memorial. A design is in progress and the granite will be donated by The Quartz Worktop Company Limited a local company. Planning permission is required which will cost £250. Grounds works is estimated at £2,000. There will be brickwork surrounding the memorial the costs of which are not yet known. Local tradesmen will be used for the work. At this early stage it is suggested the memorial should be located next to OG car park. Councillors to review location for suitability etc .

8.3 Arthur Read's Memorial Bench

Cllr Shults did not take part in this item. The bench will be in Reads Lane overlooking the fields Arthur farmed. A quotation of £495 was obtained from DPS Property Maintenance to prepare a concrete plinth and secure the bench. The quotation was accepted.

8.4 Village Hall Donation

Cllr Antosiewicz did not take part in this item. It was agreed a donation of £150 be made to the Village Hall.

8.5 The Paddocks Development – Lucy Developments Limited

The clerk had spoken to the CEO of Lucy Developments Limited concerning the possibility of a donation towards the village.

He explained no units had been sold yet so he would contact us once they had been sold.

8.6 Best Kept Village Competition

It was agreed to enter the competition again this year.

8.7 VE Day

Thursday 8th May – Cllr Hugh Vale kindly agreed to

have a beacon again on his land, and Cllr Antosiewicz to ask Brian Knights if he would kindly read the proclamation.

8.8 Community Library at the bus stop

The library has operated well, and it was agreed it should be a permanent fixture after its trial period. Cllr Antosiewicz to write to Georgina Meads thanking her for the work she has put into the library.


8.9 Ridings Cottage

It was noted that reports from the Tree Officer and Ecology Officer had been put on the planning portal requesting surveys from the applicant, together with a condition of planting seventeen trees to replace the ones taken out.

8.10 Thames Water

The clerk had submitted a complaint to TW following the blockages in Silver Streer/Chapel Alley on 4th February. There was a subsequent blockage in early March. The unitary councillors were informed. The complaints dept had been in regular contact to give us notice of the scheduled cleaning of the pipes. It cannot give us a date. TW has stated that this pipe is on its annual cleaning maintenance. The pipes are not fit for purpose which TW do not accept. The only way to resolve the matter would be to have an independent review and force TW to replace the pipes. Given the poor financial state of TW, it would be a waste of our money pursuing it.

The next meeting of the Parish Council and AGM will take place on Tuesday 20th May 2025 at 7.30pm at the Village Hall.

From The Team Rector



If you find it hard work out the date of Easter every year you can blame a group of 318 bishops who met together exactly 1700 years ago at a place called Nicea in 325AD not far from modern day Istanbul. All the British bishops at time were invited to this council but I'm afraid they didn't bother going! One bishop from Gaul turned up but even the Pope in Rome sent his apologies to Emperor Constantine who had sent the invite. So the decision was left largely in the hands of Eastern bishops from Palestine, Syria, Asia Minor (Turkey) and North Africa. It was decided for us here in Buckinghamshire that in 2025 we would celebrate Easter on Sunday 20 th April. This is the first Sunday, after the first full moon, that occurs on or after the spring equinox.

It was drummed into me at school that if you don't bother voting you don't have a right to criticise the decisions made on your behalf! The British bishops missed a cracker of a meeting which was so heated that a priest called Arius reputedly got punched in the face.

Perhaps more importantly the bishops who did turn up did some profoundly important work to agree a form of words that eventually became the Nicene creed that we recite together on most Sundays in church. This is an incredible statement of faith that attempts to straddle the mystery of how Jesus is both the "Son of God" and of one "Being with [God] the Father". The creed combines the idea that "through him all things were made" with the juxtaposition that "he was made man". The creed then spells out the most central tenants of our Easter faith:

"For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures."

I would like to invite you all to come to church this Easter. Whilst I'm still hoping that no priests get punched in the face this year, I can say with certainty that if you don't come you will be missing out!

Easter is the most important date in the Christian calendar. Every year, Christians around the world remember Jesus' crucifixion and celebrate his resurrection three days later.

But how did the egg come to represent Easter? In this article, Food Historian Sam Bilton takes a look at some of the theories, explores the traditions that have come and gone over the centuries, and shows you how to make your own traditional Easter Egg.

Early Easter Eggs

Throughout history, people across the world have given each other eggs at spring festivals to mark the seasons. Early Christians in Mesopotamia dyed eggs in the period after Easter. The practice was adopted by the Orthodox Churches, and from there it spread into Western Europe. Eggs represent new life and rebirth, and it's thought that this ancient custom was absorbed into Easter celebrations.

During Lent, when Christians fasted to mark Jesus' time in the wilderness, eggs were one of the foods that people weren't allowed to eat (incidentally, this is why we make pancakes on Shrove Tuesday). So when Easter Sunday came around, tucking into an egg was a real treat.

Various traditions and superstitions sprang up around the egg at Easter. Eggs laid on Good Friday were said to turn into diamonds if they were kept for 100 years. Some thought that eggs cooked on Good Friday and eaten on Easter would promote fertility and prevent sudden death, and it became the custom to have your eggs blessed before you ate them. It was also said that if your egg had two yolks, you'd soon become rich. In Devon and Cornwall, people used to play a game like conkers with their eggs, hitting them against each other until one of them cracked.




I know that buses are vital for residents here in Cublington. People depend on buses for getting to work, school, the shops or to see friends and family.

Lots of constituents speak to me about their local services. I know that whilst there are some good services, there are many problems that need addressing as well. My constituents across Aylesbury have for too long put up with unacceptable delays, cancellations and scrapped services, including Arriva's decision to end bus services to Oxford and High Wycombe.

Since being elected as your MP, I have been pleased with the Government's announcement that it would allocate £6.7m to Buckinghamshire Council to improve bus services, in addition to maintaining a cap on fares. We are moving fast and taking bold steps to deliver better buses for local communities in Buckinghamshire.

However, I know there is more to be done.



The survey will be used to help understand how many residents travel by bus, how satisfied they are with the current service, which improvements can be made to improve the passenger experience, and how to increase passenger numbers across Aylesbury and the surrounding villages. I would encourage both regular bus users and people who don't use public transport to take part in the survey. I want to understand your experiences of local bus services, so I can push as your MP for better, more accessible public transport for everyone in our community.
